A Club for All



No Horror Show as Lions Win

Fresh from Halloween festivities, bobbing apples and the like (Happy Days), it was time to see if it was trick or treat time (eyeball rolling and sighing allowed).

Abercymboi won their last game, away to Cambrian Welfare, and were standing (sitting permitted) two places behind the Lions in the League.

Llanishen, on the other hand (other appendages are available), have suffered two losing bonus points defeats, against Abercynon and Barry.

Not long after, the opposition 10, made a good break and only good scramble defence kept them out. On 30 minutes a penalty, conceded at a scrum, enable Abercwmboi to retake the lead.

Llanishen then had plenty of chances to get into the opposition 22 but missed kicks enabled Abercwmboi to counter-attack. One of these led to Llanishen conceding a penalty and the successful penalty took them six points ahead.

From the kick off Abercymboi conceded a penalty and complaining to the ref drew a yellow card for one of the hometown props. A great chance to attack but the chosen scrum was driven back and Llanishen conceded a penalty.

A good steal at a line out, and swift passing, allowed Hayden to make a good break. The attack fizzled out but there was positivity in evidence and the feeling the tide was turning in the Lions favour.

An Abercymboi short line out was read, by Lewis, he's got a great rugby brain that lad. He intercepted the pass back to the hooker and made good yards before popping the ball to Ewan who, ahem, slight cough, ghosted through to score a try. A difficult kick but Kieran nailed it to put 'The Lions' in front.

From the kick off Abercwmboi conceded a penalty and allowed Llanishen to exit their half.

The attacking intent was obvious from the sideline and the constant pressure allowed Llanishen to progress up the pitch. A five-metre line out was won and quickly passed to Miles who crashed over, under the posts, Kieran converting.

Eight points clear, time to consolidate the lead. Not so fast Llanishen conceded a penalty, for jumping out of a tackle, from the kick off, back to a five-point lead.

Llanishen went straight back on the attack, but a further penalty offence meant Ben was shown a yellow card.

Twenty minutes to go, so, time, for fans of The Red Zone, 'The Witching Hour' when wins can become loses and loses can become wins.

The Lions attacking was continuous, not spine-tingling you understand, but relentless. The forwards were supplying a constant stream of ball, allowing Lloyd Saunders and Hayden to move possession wide, allowing Chris a chance to run at the opposition.

From one of these attacks Abercwmboi conceded a penalty and Kieran kicked it to give a little breathing space.

The attacking continued but the final pass, or desperate tackle (What other kind are there? A tap tackle, Phillip. Be quiet, you fool). * SPECTATORS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Spectators must not verbally or physically abuse Referees or other match officials before, during or after a match. The Referee's and other match officials' contribution to a contribution to a matches is vital. Without referees there can be no match.
- After a match, spectators must respect the Players and officials of both teams and must not under any circumstances approach them in anything other than a sporting and friendly manner.
- Spectators must not approach a referee or any other match official after the match to discuss the events of the match.


